Bob Stevenson

Master Craftsman and Coordinator of the Design in Wood Exhibition

In preparation for the Design in Wood Exhibition, we will look at how to reproduce a masterpiece in furniture.

Bob Stevenson will give a slide presentation on his work. The program will show in detail just how he built that beautiful game table which was on the backcover of the July/August 2001 Fine Woodworking Magazine issue #150.

In addition to organizing our Design in Wood Exhibition, Bob runs his own business where he restores collectable furniture and builds custom furniture specializing in Federal Period recreations.

To tie into this month's Lie-Nielsen Tool sale, following the slide presentation Bob will discuss and demonstrate the selection, sharpening and use of a handplane.

SDFWA Hand Tool Group Purchase 2002

*** April 24th Meeting ***

Many of us start out woodworking with the idea that anything that needs to be done can be accomplished with a power tool. As we become more experienced and take on projects requiring complicated joinery and work with quality hardwoods, we begin to realize that hand tools play an important role in producing a finely crafted piece. It also becomes apparent that there is a huge difference between quality hand tools and the offerings normally found in the large chain stores. Tools offered by the manufacturers for our group purchase are of the highest quality – In the words of Thomas Lie-Nielsen “Heirloom quality tools” and most importantly, tools that work well right out of the box. We will have many of these tools available for you to examine at the April 24th meeting as well as some demonstration tools to try out.

About the manufacturers & tools



Again this year we have offerings from the ever-popular **Lie-Nielsen Toolworks** of Warren, Maine. They manufacture a wide selection of the highest quality planes and are now also producing superb handsaws.

Tools - Lie-Nielsen Toolworks makes the best quality metal planes available today. Machining is very precise, quality is consistently high, and they are backed by a manufacturer's lifetime warranty. These tools are made to be used and you will find when you own one that you will be drawn to using it often because it performs so well.



H.N.T. Gordon is a small family owned business in Australia that produces beautiful hand-made woodworking planes of exotic hardwoods such as Ironwood, Ebony, and Gidgee, which is a very hard and heavy member of the acacia family native to Australia.

Tools - Terry Gordon of H.N.T. Gordon takes a somewhat different approach with his hand-made planes. He strives to achieve the highest performance cutting hardwoods and difficult grain by using a higher blade pitch (angle) which helps to prevent tearout. Blades can also be mounted in the plane “upside down” presenting a 90-degree angle to the surface of the wood, which turns them into a scraper, which is capable of dealing with “cranky” grain situations. Terry selects tough exotic woods for plane bodies that are beautiful and also have less friction (than metal) when

planing. His planes are reasonably priced and due to the current weakness of the Australian dollar, they are now a bargain!



Glen-Drake Toolworks is also a small family business located in the well-known Mendicino county woodworking enclave that is home of The College of The Redwoods. They manufacture the Tite-Mark marking gauge. This is an incredibly fine quality tool – You won't want to set it down!

Tools - Kevin Glen-Drake of Glen-Drake Toolworks produces what is by far the best wheel type marking gauge available anywhere. This is the only tool that Lie-Nielsen Toolworks markets that they do not manufacture themselves – which speaks volumes about the quality. They are also working on some innovative veneer scoring and mortise blades. Kevin plans to be present at the meeting to demonstrate the Tite-Mark and chat with members.

About the sale Sale is open to SDFWA members only. Orders must be prepaid and can be made in the following ways.

Ordering

1. You may mail in the Order Form along with your check made payable to Craftsman Studio. Orders must be postmarked by April 24th.
2. You may purchase tools at the April 24th meeting using the Order Form and pay either by cash or check made payable to Craftsman Studio. We will not be able to accept credit cards at the meeting.
3. You may order online at www.craftsmanstudio.com/sdfwa.htm using your Visa or MasterCard. This is a secure 128 bit encrypted ordering site – you do not need to be concerned about the security of your credit card information. You can place your order anytime before the cutoff of 12PM (noon) PST on 25 April.

Once all orders have been received, we will place a single group order with each of the three manufacturers.

Delivery Schedule

1. Lie-Nielsen Toolworks products – We hope to have received the majority of the Lie-Nielsen items by the May 22nd meeting and will have them available to pick up at the meeting.
2. Glen-Drake Toolworks products - We hope to have received all of the Glen-Drake Toolworks items by the May 22nd meeting and will have them available to pick up at the meeting.
3. H.N.T. Gordon products – Air mail delivery from Australia takes about three weeks and since each of these planes are hand-made it will take a little longer to produce the planes for the order. Our best estimate is that we will have the planes six weeks (mid-June) from the order date. See delivery options below.

Delivery Options If you do not specify, we will bring everything available to the May 22nd meeting – items received after the meeting will be made available at the Craftsman Studio store (See new location in this newsletter) for pickup. You will be notified when your order is in by email, or if none is listed, by telephone.

1. You may pick up your order at the May 22nd meeting for Lie-Nielsen and Glen-Drake items for no shipping cost.
2. For a flat \$10 fee we will ship your order to you as soon as it arrives - no matter which manufacturer or how many items you purchased - This is the fastest way.
3. If you provide an email address or phone number we will notify you so you can pick up your order at the new Craftsman Studio store in the Adams Avenue “Antique Row” of University Heights.
4. If you specifically request it, we will bring your items to the July 31st meeting.

New User Recommendations

I am often asked for my recommendation regarding plane selections for new users that perhaps do not have a great deal of experience with hand tools but would like something practical, and not too difficult to master.

Here are my new user picks in no particular order of preference:

Lie-Nielsen LN-102 Low Angle Block Plane \$80.75 – A small comfortable to use plane that performs extremely well and will soon become your method of choice for rounding edges and all of the little jobs around the shop.

Lie-Nielsen LN-62 Low angle Jack Plane \$191.25 – Probably the most versatile and user friendly plane ever made – This plane will perform flattening and smoothing duties on soft and hard wood, is often better than a standard bench plane for difficult grain and is far easier to adjust and sharpen.

H.N.T. Gordon Smoothing Plane \$114.75 – This is unquestionably the best value for a true smoothing plane on the market. Patterned after the Chinese style planes in use in Malaysia, these planes can be pushed or pulled & used with or without the handle. For greatest flexibility add the HSS Blade \$36.47 so you can use it as a scraping plane as well

H.N.T. Gordon Shoulder Plane \$77-\$82 – These are a necessity to anyone making mortise and tenon joints. Also handy for adjusting rabbets that turned out a little shallow. You won't find a comparable quality plane anywhere near this price – Why you could splurge and get it in Ebony at these prices!

H.N.T. Gordon Adjusting Mallet \$17 – If you anticipate getting any of the H.N.T. Gordon planes or have your own wood planes, this is a must have. In Terry's words “it is purpose-made for adjusting planes” and it works exceedingly well.

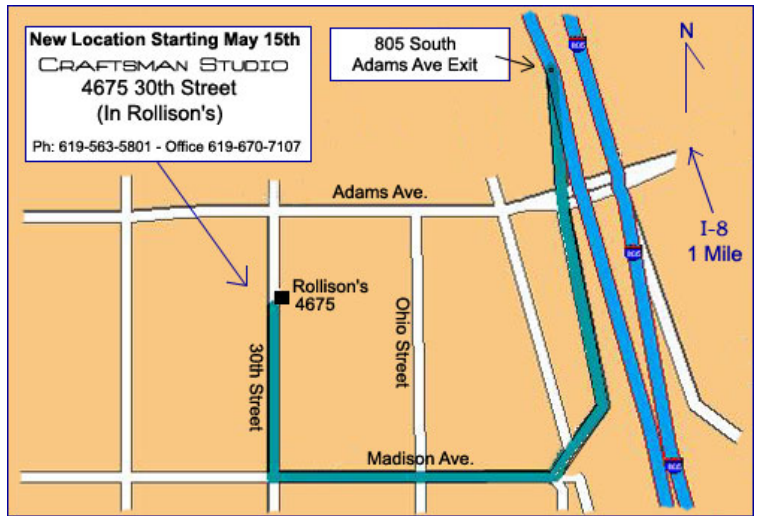
