Wood Play

Toys, cars and racing are a kid's dream come true.

The San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association are combining all three into a fun workshop " Making Wooden Toys That Move," 10:30 a.m. to noon April 12 in the Mingei International Museum in Escondido.

"It's a hands-on class for children and their parents to create a small wooden toy," said Charlie Pinkus, an association member who will lead the class. "They'll be supplied with a car already cut out of wood and they'll paint and shellac it and then attach wheels to it."

Once the paint and shellac has dried, the kids will race their creations down a ramp and see which one goes the greatest distance.

Pinkus, a lifelong woodworker, will talk about working with wood and demonstrate how more complex toys are made. He'll be bringing a number of those toys with him for the children to play with.

Many of those toys are part of the ongoing Woodworkers Association's charitable work: They make approximately 4,000 wooden toys a year and donate them to Children's Hospital, Balboa Naval Hospital and other places.

No woodworking experience is needed for this class and all materials will be supplied. The cost is \$10 for member of the Mingei and \$15 for nonmembers.

Charlie Bierman: Bay Park Toy Maker

Part of the mission of the Clairemont Community News is to thank and recognize the folks in our Clairemont/Bay Park neighborhood who are contributing to the betterment of our community. This month, we invited Charlie Bierman to tell us about his volunteer toy making.

For over 15 years I have been making toys for needy children. I'm one of the leaders of the toy making community service of the San Diego Fine Woodworking Association (SDFWA). The primary community service of the SDFWA is the Design in Wood show at the San Diego County Fair.

My wife Helen and I have lived on Frankfort Street for over 51 years. I was part of the original Convair design team for the development of the Atlas and Centaur missiles in 1955. Our three children attended local schools and have all moved away.

After I retired in 1982, I returned seriously to my hobby of woodworking. After completing major furniture and other smaller projects, I began toy making with SDFWA. Having an engineering background, designing the toys and fixtures to make them was an easy and natural first step for me. Recruiting SDFWA members for toy making was the next step. Over many years now the toy production has risen to about 4,000 a year. My interest is in making toys that are playable, that have action and are durable, safe and of high quality. Nearly all the wood is donated by local companies. The association pays for parts and finish.

Palomar Community College requested that I conduct classes in toy making. So for nine years I have helped coordinate, prepare material and teach a class of 40-45 men and women students. The 350-400 toys produced there are added to the SDFWA toy donation program.

I also conduct classes in "toy making" at elementary schools, boy scouts, museums, etc. I believe our future depends on the new generation of children. If we can show them in some way we care about them, especially the needy, it will benefit us all.

In January Charlie was honored at the SDFWA meeting with a plaque which said "In appreciation for many years of dedicated service and innovation for developing the toy program". Thank you Charlie for your Volunteer work."
