April Program

Reproducing an 18th Century Walnut Italian Side Chair – Queen Anne Style

By Bob Stevenson

Bob will discuss all the steps necessary to reproduce the chair:

1. Measuring the chair
2. Creating a full size plan
3. Making patterns
4. Selecting the wood
5. Cutting the joints
6. Shaping all the parts
7. Assembling the chair
8. Finishing the chair

Bob will bring in the original chair and his reproduction.

This will be a very interesting and educational presentation. These chairs were constructed and joined with draw-pinned mortise & tenon joints.

Bob is the chairman of the Shows & Exhibits Committee and makes custom furniture and restores collectable furniture professionally. He has had his work published in many of the national woodworking publications. Bob is also chairman of the Advisory Committee of the Society of American Period Furniture Makers and was recently published in "Period Furniture" the SAPFM Journal.

Mentor Program

Saturday, May 9, 2009

9:00 AM to 1:00 PM (could be longer)

We are pleased to have Bob Stevenson present the May Mentor program on Making Mortise and Tenon Joints. Ten lucky participants will learn how to make these joints that are so important in woodworking. Both machine cut and hand cut joints will be taught. Participants will make a mortise and tenon joint by hand. Bob is a master craftsman who is skilled in hand tool joinery. The class is limited to 10 people and sign up will be available at the April meeting. The class is limited to 10 people. If you cannot make the meeting please call me and I will sign you up over the phone. Please do not sign up if you think you cannot make the class.

This is a hands-on class and participants will make a mortise and tenon joint during the class. We will have a few tools available but we recommend you bring your own tools. Learning with the tools you will be using in the future makes the experience much more valuable. As you learn and practice, the tools almost become an extension of your body and you can develop a better feel by using your own tools. This is especially true of handsaws. Get a good one and expect to use it a long time. Bob will have stock prepared and handouts for the participants.

(The following is my edit of Bob's description of the class)

The mentor class will be on Mortise & Tenon joints.

Various types of mortise & tenon joints will be discussed followed by Bob's demonstration of the following;

1. How to lay out mortise and tenon joints - whether by hand or machine cut.
2. Machine cut a mortise with a bench top mortise machine
3. Cut a tenon on the table saw
4. Chop a mortise by hand
5. Saw a tenon by hand

The group will then;

1. Learn to lay out a mortise and tenon.
2. Chop a mortise by hand
3. Cut a tenon to fit the mortise by hand.

Although we have some tools, you should bring your own tools: (All are available at Rockler or Craftsman Studio. Be sure to get your member discount)

1. Mortise chisel – 3/8" (or 1/2" is acceptable)
2. Wood Mallet
3. Back saw (should be fine tooth) – examples: Lie Nielson Dovetail or Back Saw or Japanese Dozuki. (Lie Nielsen and Japanese saws are available at Bill Kohr's Craftsman studio and Japanese Dozuki saws are available at Rockler)
4. Mortise gauge (adjustable pin)
5. Marking gauge or cutting gauge
6. Small Tri Square
7. 6" ruler
8. A sharp mortise chisel 3/8" or 1"
9. Marking knife and sharp pencil

Remember, this is your exhibit and SDFWA's number one activity for the year. We need everyone to be involved in some way i.e. **ENTER, HELP WITH SET UP, VOLUNTEER AT THE EXHIBIT, HELP WITH TAKE DOWN.** We will provide great food and refreshments along with a generous number of free passes to the Fair just for a few hours of your time. You will get two (2) passes for each shift you sign up for and four (4) passes a day for set up and take down volunteers. You even get passes for entering.

Here is how you sign up to volunteer in the 19th Century Chair Shop or to be a gallery floor walker.

NEW SYSTEM THIS YEAR

This year there will be several ways for DIW volunteers to sign up for the shifts wanted. In the past you could sign up at the General Meeting or you could call or email volunteer coordinator, Eric Lunde, with the date and times you wanted after getting the available dates and times from the SDFWA web site. These options are still available to you this year plus an addition of a New System to completely sign up online.

NEW METHOD

To sign up online, go to the SDFWA web site. You will need your membership number from your membership card and your email address on file with the SDFWA (the one you used on your membership application). You will be asked for these items on the log-in page. If your member number and email matches our data base, you will be taken to a log-in page where you will create an ID and password for the web site. (This log-in ID and password will enable you to not only sign up for DIW volunteer shifts but will also enable you to access the upcoming new members only section on our web site later this year.) After you have logged-in, you will be taken to a volunteer sign up page where you and/or your spouse can reserve volunteer shifts in the shop or gallery.

If the computer method or meeting sign ups are not possible for you, please call Eric Lunde at 858-487-7644 and leave your name, phone number and dates and times you desire and Eric will enable this for you depending on availability of the dates and times. If the times are already taken, Eric will call you back with alternatives.
