## **WE NEED YOUR HELP**

The Design in Wood Exhibition at the Del Mar County Fair opens on June 5, 2015, and runs through July 5, 2015. In order to properly staff the exhibit, we desperately need more volunteers to walk the gallery floor and to help make chairs in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century workshop.

Absolutely no experience or special skills are needed for either of these positions. Whatever you need to know will be taught to you when you show up for your shift. There are several advantages to donating some of your time:

(1) On the gallery floor you will have an opportunity to examine the entries, rather than just walking through quickly and glancing at them. Fielding questions from the public could draw your attention to details that you might otherwise have overlooked. (Don't worry about questions to which you don't know the answers. You can always ask one of the staff members who will be nearby).

(2) Working in the chair shop allows you to work with hand tools that you might seldom use. (Don't worry if you don't know how, because you will be given a short lesson and you will look like an expert to the public).

(3) For each shift you will receive two (2) fair tickets. Sign up for more than one shift and you might collect enough tickets for you, your family, your friends and neighbors. You will have to use one (1) ticket for yourself in order to enter the fairgrounds each time you come for your shift.

(4) Sign up for closing shifts on the gallery floor and receive four (4) tickets per shift.

(5) Volunteers can use an "employees only" gate and avoid the long lines at the main gate. Early entry to the fair allows you to visit some exhibits that are not yet open to the public.

Then use your membership number and email address login and complete your sign-up. **Note:** This method of sign-up will be available only until 5:00pm on May 8, 2015. ## **2015 SDFWA Fall Seminar**

It is time to mark your calendars for our Fall Seminar. This year's seminar will be September 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup>, with the same times as last year: Friday 7am – 9pm; Saturday 8am – 4pm; and Sunday 8am – 3pm. We are still working out the details, but the price will be about the same as last year with lunches and snacks provided. Location will be the same: Francis Parker School, 6501 Linda Vista Road, San Diego, CA 92111.

Our featured presenter this year is Steve Latta. Steve is a well-known teacher and woodworker who has been featured in Fine Woodworking Magazine and even has his own brand of inlay tools from Lie Nielsen Toolworks. His bio and description of his presentation follows below:

### **San Diego Presentation Description**

Over the course of the weekend, we will cover all the



steps necessary to make a Federal Side Table, a delicate but formal piece with much to offer. Day one will focus primarily on joinery and how to do it efficiently. I am a huge advocate of a "sequential" approach to building which takes a much more refined look at the construction of a piece. We will consider how to systematically dimension our stock, and then tackle the joinery with an "A" leads to "B" leads to "C" approach that stresses accuracy and fluidity. Most professionals that I know gain as much satisfaction from the performance of building the piece as they do in the piece itself.

Day two will focus on ornamentation. We will look at bandings, bellflowers, stringing, veneered and bordered drawer fronts, and both the rural and urban traditions of Federal inlay. Some of the most magical work was done by country cabinetmakers doing their best to interpret the work of their city cousins.

We will branch out beyond the ornamentation on our table and look at other examples that will add to our discussion. My fundamental goal with this part of the presentation is to demystify the inlay process and encourage you to try it yourselves.

Steve Latta makes both contemporary and traditional furniture while teaching woodworking at Thaddeus Stevens College in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. He is a contributing editor to Fine Woodworking magazine and has released several videos on inlay and furniture construction. He has lectured at Colonial Williamsburg, The Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts, and Winterthur Museum, as well as numerous other schools and guilds. Working in conjunction with Lie Nielsen Toolworks, he helped develop and market a set of contemporary inlay tools. Steve is an active member in the Furniture Society, The Society of American Period Furniture Makers and the Pennsylvania Guild of Craftsmen. He lives with his wife, Elizabeth, and their three children—Fletcher, Sarah and Grace—in rural southeastern Pennsylvania.

Our Own Member Shop An Exciting Prospect!

For the last year or so, a small but determined Task Force has been exploring the feasibility of our Association creating a “Member Shop”. At the March meeting of your Board of Directors, the findings and recommendations of this group were presented. After much discussion, there was a unanimous vote to approve the completion of a formal and comprehensive plan on what it would require to open and operate such a facility.

A “Member Shop” is indeed an exciting prospect. It would ensure that every one of our members would have access to a fully equipped workshop to allow them to build whatever they wish. But it would mean far more than that. Those members with their own shops would have access to larger, more specialized tools not found in most home shops, i.e., CNC machine, laser engraver, panel saw, large capacity thickness sander and planer, etc. It would also enable to us to provide a level of training and support to our members far beyond anything we’ve done before.

As part of our “due diligence”, we’ve been in close contact with the other three Guilds across the country that currently operate their own shops: Portland, Oregon; Kansas City, Missouri; and Greenville, South Carolina. All three have approached the project differently. All

three operate differently. But all three have one thing in common: They are ecstatic about the results! Each area has seen dramatic increases in membership. And all three have already had to expand the size of their facility.

Portland is the newest of the three. In their first full year (2014) they offered 80 different training classes and seminars to their members!

As you might imagine, this is an enormous undertaking. There are complex financial, organizational and legal issues to work through and I have volunteered to coordinate this effort. We want this to be an open, inclusive and transparent process. We welcome the input of every member and look forward to your support in developing a viable plan that can make our own shop a reality.

Mike Davis' Pro Bono Work:



The USS Somerset (LPD-25), like her sister ships the USS New York and the USS Arlington, was named in commemoration of the September 11, 2001 attacks. The name honors the passengers and crew of United Airlines Flight 93 whose actions prevented terrorist hijackers from reaching their intended target, forcing the airplane to crash near Shanksville, Somerset County, PA. Over the weeks following the Flight 93 crash, recovery personnel retrieved more than 95 percent of the airplane's wreckage from the crash site. An American flag was hoisted on the top of a power shovel or "dragline" on a hill dominating the area. The dragline had been used in coal stripping at one time, and the equipment with the flag became a symbol of the effort. In the summer of 2008, the dragline's 22 ton steel bucket was melted down and cast into LPD-25's bow stem, embodying the strength and determination of the people of the United States: to recover, to rally, to take the fight to the enemy.

The Somerset was built with a separate room for their First Class (E-6) to eat in, called their "mess" in Navy terms. But unfortunately it was built without doors. The members of the First Class Association wanted to put some doors up to give themselves some privacy and quiet. They contacted the SDFWA to see if someone could produce a set of two doors for their mess. Dick

Ugoretz, our president at the time, reached out to everyone he knew who was in the Navy in hopes of finding someone willing to build them, but everyone was too busy. At the MakerPlace shop tour last year, he mentioned it to a group of us and I volunteered to build them. After all, a long time ago, I was a First Class in the US Navy on a ship that didn't even have a separate room for their First Class to eat in, so I thought who better to build them? I would have really appreciated something like this back then.

Dick and I visited the USS Somerset last year. We had a very nice tour of the ship from stem to stern and from the main deck to the storage areas. It was an extremely interesting ship to be on and brought back some memories for me. We were also shown to the mess room and were a little surprised to see that the two door openings were on the small side, were built with rounded corners, and the walls were at about a 15 degree tilt outwards. All challenges for building a rectangular door, but after taking several measurements, and talking about it for a while, I was on my way to building the doors.

I decided to go with a relatively simple door that was mounted in a frame which would allow it to stand upright and inside of the tilted hatches. The door was a standard frame and panel construction with the frame built from rough walnut from Tropical and Exotic Hardwoods and birch plywood panels from TH&H; all solidly fastened together with some beefy mortise and tenon joints, and dadoes to hold the plywood panels. I used some solid brass spring hinges and a pair of nice brass door locksets to finish them off. There are plans still in the works for two beautiful door plaques to either be laser cut or cut on a CNC machine by Mike McElhiney, but the doors have been delivered to the ship and are now residing in the First Class Mess.

Building the doors was a bit of work, but it was nice to do something for a few of the many people in uniform who are serving their country. If it makes their time on the USS Somerset a little more enjoyable, then it is well worth the labor. Now there is a rumor that the Chief Petty Officers want a door too.....
