Profoundly beautiful and useful wooden objects — chairs, tables, benches and cabinets, by George Nakashima (1905–1990) will be on view at Mingei International Museum from **November 2003 through May 2004**.

Complementing George Nakashima's woodwork are paintings and drawings by his friend Ben Shahn, framed by Mr. Nakashima.

The exhibition is accompanied by a major new book *Nature, Form and Spirit: The Life and Legacy of George Nakashima* by Mira Nakashima-Yarnall. The 276-page book, published by Harry N. Abrams, Inc., includes 265 illustrations (160 in full color).

Mingei International Museum, located on the Plaza de Panama in Balboa Park, is open from 10 until 4 Tuesday through Sunday, and closed on Mondays and National Holidays. Admission is \$6.00 for adults and \$3.00 for children 6-17 and students with ID. For information, call 619-239-0003.

We will need approximately 20 – 25 members to help with this production run. Each volunteer will be enrolled in a special one-unit class and receive credit for same. Fees will be paid by the SDFWA. All materials will be supplied by the Fairgrounds. A list will be provided at the General Meeting for signups. All members, whether you are a student or not, are welcome to sign up. Past or present students of Palomar are strongly encouraged to help out. It is anticipated that the job will take the better part of 5 days, March 15 – 20, 2004. Times and further information will be provided to volunteers. If you are able to help with the case building, please sign the list at the meeting and provide an email address and/or a phone number so we can keep you informed..

Set up this year will be a challenge. However, we need to start a week earlier and complete the setup by Memorial Day Weekend. Set up will start as early as May 23, 2004, and continue all week in order to receive entries on June 3, 2004. Library Donation

The price for the 44 books was \$1056.32. The library is also ordering another 20 or so books worth about 500 dollars, all on our thousand-dollar donation. Several of the 44 were 25-40 dollars each, the Historic Millwork book was 70 dollars, and Romeyn Hough's "Woodbook" was \$74.99. In addition to our receiving \$500 in matching funds, the library receives another \$500 match from the City of San Diego to spend for other kinds of books. It's a really good deal for both us and for the library.
