January Program

Figured Woods

Have you ever wondered how figured wood is identified, located and processed so you can use it in your special woodworking projects? Ever wonder where the wood used in those beautiful guitars used by rock stars comes from? Only 1 in 10,000 trees has figure that is stunning enough to be considered instrument grade. How is that one in 10,000 found? One way is Reprise Hardwoods, a specialty lumber company owned and operated by Dave Radosevich and Bob Watanabe. They specialize in reclaimed lumber from Oregon chipper mills. Every day, thousands of trees are brought in to these chipper mills. Reprise has arranged for the logs at these mills to be inspected for quality and figure. They are able to go in and rescue the very best of the logs. The sheer volume of logs accessed by Reprise hardwoods allows for reclamation, milling and processing of very high grade figured lumber that is used for high end furniture and instrument making.

Both Bob and Dave are avid woodworkers and wood hunters. They run Reprise Hardwoods as a part time business. Bob is a 26 year member of the Los Angeles County Fire Department. He has served as a firefighter and paramedic, and currently holds the position of firefighter-specialist. He drives a 100 foot quint which is the truck with the ladders and the additional driver steering the back end. The 100' refers to the aerial ladder length. Some of the duties his company performs include physical extrication of trapped auto collision victims, swift water rescue, forcible entry, and ventilation of structure fires.

Dave works in aerospace for Northrop Grumman Space Technology as a Sub Project Manager. Some of his current assignments include building the Solar Panels for major satellites. He has worked on other space craft including Chandra (Nasa's X-ray telescope), Milstar, TDRSS, EOS (new weather satellite system that gives 4 day advanced warnings for major hurricane and storm systems), and Cassini (Saturn's latest arrival). He does other projects that are classified that he can't speak about. His non woodworking related hobbies include Astronomy.

The presentation they have for January's meeting will cover the details of how they got started in their business, how they find wood, mill and process it, discuss methods of drying and other challenges in running and operating a specialty wood business. This seminar should provide an entertaining and interesting look into the specialty wood market and business of reclaiming hardwoods for our use in woodworking and the unique challenges they face in bringing this wood to you.

January Membership Report

As of 3 January 2006 we have 510 paid members. Six are new members and 504 (33.4% of 2005 members) are renewals.

At the close of 2005 our membership was 1508, 101 (6.3%) below that of 2004. This reduction was from non-renewing members and a lesser number of new members. More than 50 people joined in the last quarter of 2005, taking advantage of the special rate to carry their membership through 2006. There have been more members leaving the area than in prior years and a number of deaths and illnesses have been a factor.

We are presently revising our records-keeping to MS Access, a database format. This will retain the availability to present a spreadsheet (MS Excel) of membership as desired.

Capability for handling mailings, via Mail Merge, seminar registrations, and other applications will be provided.

From a Humble Beginning

Last year I talked with Ed Gladney about writing a series of newsletter articles that would give a behind the scene look at the first 25 years of the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association. In this edition, I will describe the woodworking scene in San Diego before the association was formed, the people who were involved with its beginning, and how the organization became the key to opening the door to the Design In Wood Exhibit at the Del Mare Fair.

In the 1950's, San Diego was known as a "sleepy town." This same description could be used for the woodworking community here in the 1970's. There were a few woodworkers, but few people knew of them. In fact communications between woodworkers was very sparse. Taunton Press only started publishing The Fine Woodworking magazine in 1975.

Larry Hunter ran a woodworking and design program at San Diego State College. Nick Disparti started the woodworking program at Palomar Junior College in 1965, and Steve Kirby joined him in 1974.

The Industrial Arts exhibit at Del Mar Fair was about the only show case for woodworking in this area at the time. It was heavily represented by very strong high school woodworking programs. These high school shops not only served the young students, but also met the needs of the adult community with their evening programs. It was through one of these evening programs that I learned about and became involved with this fine group.

In the late '70's, I became interested in improving my woodworking skills. My nephew David Quessenberry told me I should take classes from his former high school shop teacher, Walt Zmolek at Mission Bay High School. I enrolled in the class and met Lyn Rybarczk and Richard Griebee. We developed a close friendship and it is partly because of these two men that I am writing these articles.

During Mr. "Z"'s classes I focused my efforts on improving my skills. On the other hand, Richard and Lyn looked beyond the present. Richard complained that his wooden bowls made from exotic wood were only taken home, shown to his wife, and put on a shelf never to be seen again. Lyn also complained that there was no venue in San Diego such as the Signature in San Francisco or the fine woodworking exhibit at the Marin County Fair in Northern California. So, Lyn suggested that they find a way to show their work at the Del Mar Fair. A meeting was arranged with the fair coordinators.

At the meeting Lyn, Richard, Chuck Masters, and Jim Cherry made a very convincing argument to add an annual fine woodworking exhibit. The fair representatives were quite receptive to the idea and asked what group they represented. When these eager woodworkers replied that they just wanted to show their work, the coordinators suggested that they needed to be some kind of an organization. The four of them went out into the parking lot for a strategy meeting, kicked in \$15.00 each for seed money, and the San Diego Fine Woodworking Association was born.

About this time, the Cutting Edge, a store specializing in woodworking supplies was about to open in Mira Mesa. Lyn contacted its owner Brian Murphy and its manager, Chuck Masters about setting up a sign-up table for the newly formed association at the store's grand opening.

The first meeting of the San Diego Fine Woodworking Association was held at Del Mar Heights elementary school where Lyn taught. About 50 of us charter members attended that night and Jim Cherry was elected president. Richard Griebee became our first newsletter editor. Chuck Masters became the first superintendent of the fine woodworking exhibit. Harry Baldwin volunteered to take care of our membership list, a job he still does. Lyn Rybarczk is known as the founder of our association and still considers it as his baby.

Some time after that first meeting, Lyn received a letter from the Fine Woodworking magazine stating that the name "Fine Woodworking" was property of Taunton Press and our group was forbidden to use it. This is why the organization is now called the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association. The logo of the Jorgenson clamp that appears with our name was designed by Bob Mason. This was quite a humble beginning for the largest woodworking group in the United States.

What a rare and wonderful thing it is to have a present carry such meaning.

Thank you for your continued desire to help others, even in a year like 2005 when there have been so many disasters tugging on your heartstrings and pocketbooks. Our work at Voices for Children continues, and the desperate cases of children abandoned and abused by the adults in their lives command our attention. Approximately 8,000 children are under the jurisdiction of the San Diego County Court due to severe abuse, neglect or abandonment, and close to 400 are waitlisted for assistance from Voices for Children. Our volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocates, called CASAs, mentor and befriend these children, providing some level of stability and constancy in their tumultuous lives. CASAs also make recommendations to the judge about placement and about a child's other important and unique needs.

As someone said, "It is better to build children than to repair adults." Your gift will make a difference, building hope and faith in children's lives during this special time of year. In whatever ways you celebrate the traditions of the season, I hope it brings you and yours much joy.


