Peter Schlech

Winner of the Design in Wood Sponsors Trophy for Best in Show for the last three years

Peter Schlech was born on the island of Oahu, and was raised and educated in many countries and among many cultures. After attending boarding schools in Scotland and Massachusetts, he enrolled in the University of Miami, and later the University of Maryland, pursuing studies in literature and art. It was in the Chesapeake Bay area of Maryland that his lifetime passion for working in wood began. After an apprenticeship as a boat builder in Annapolis, he began a thirty-year career as a designer-builder of yacht interiors. After attending his first exhibition of fine woodworking in 1995, he was inspired by the beauty, quality, and freedom of design in the work he saw there, and determined to try his hand in this new field. In the design and construction of studio furniture and accessories he found a renewed passion for the art of woodworking that quickly became apparent in his new work. Since that time, his designs have received more than seventeen awards for woodworking excellence, and have been featured in local and national publications, galleries, and museum collections. He is on the front cover and is the featured article of the March–April issue Woodworker West. Perhaps you will recall his bent veneer lamp from last years show. Besides sharing his work with us, he will be demonstrating how he makes the large curved veneer works such as the lamp. His work can be seen on his website- www.peterschlech.com.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT FOR MARCH 2002

As of 7 March 2002, we had 1247 members, of which 107 were new members. Renewals number 1140, which is 71.5% of the 1595 at the end of 2001. In late February 665 letters were sent out, reminding members of the need to renew, to keep their benefits active. There have been many responses, some 200 the first week. More are needed.

A significant number of members have opted for receiving the newsletter from our website in lieu of via snail mail. We are encouraging new and old members to sign up with our E-mail mailing list, so we can send a group alert that the new newsletter is on the website.

Your cooperation is appreciated and much needed. Small things that take you only seconds add up to major time demands when dealing with 1600 member applications/renewals. Despite the **bold, all-capitals request to PLEASE PRINT CLEARLY**, some of the info on applications is illegible. For addresses, this is crucial. Sending only a check with your name and address, does not eliminate our need for a complete application form. Lacking it requires our taking time to look up the needed info to enter into the computer file. I want to explain the need for repeating on the renewal application information which hasn't changed from last year. The checks are separated from the application form and sent to the Treasurer. The personal data is needed for the new directory I am creating, which includes the name of a card-carrying spouse, e-mail address and their preference for getting their newsletter from our website instead of by U.S. Mail. Trust me, this is much easier working from application forms than looking it up in a directory. This new directory will not need to be repeated next year, just updated for changes.. The application forms then go to Harry Baldwin for updating the mailing list.

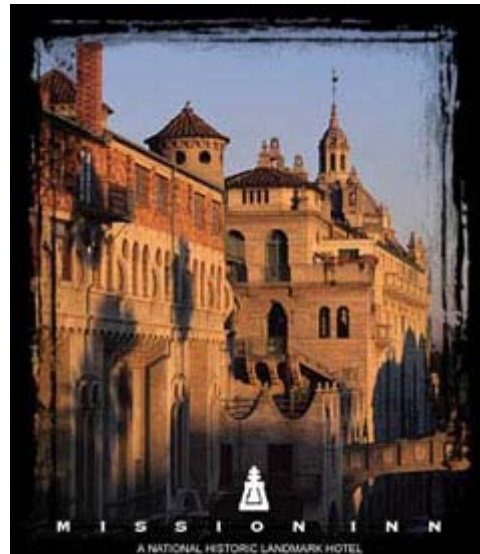

SDFWA Spring Bus Tour Extravaganza! Sam Maloof & Mission Inn Tours

Saturday 27 April – 7AM to 7PM



Sam Maloof's home



A full day of fun and excitement you won't want to miss!

Maloof Tour Includes a tour of Sam Maloof's home and workshop in Rancho Cucamonga. Sam has kindly agreed to be present for the tour and share his insights with the membership.

Maloof, born in 1916, is America's most widely admired contemporary furniture craftsman. Maloof, entirely self-taught, is one of only a handful of furniture designer-craftsmen to make his livelihood through working full time with his hands. Although his furniture has a sculptural quality and has been exhibited in major museums, he doesn't consider himself an artist, but rather a woodworker, and lets it go at that

Maloof's distinctive furniture style has developed slowly and steadily over decades, with new designs evolving from existing ones. As a result, his furniture has a timeless, classic look, its form directly related to its intended function. Evolution, not revolution, is the hallmark of his style.

Lunch Following the Maloof Tour, we will stop at a nearby SoupPlantation also in Rancho Cucamonga for lunch.

Mission Inn Tour After lunch we will visit the Mission Inn which occupies an entire city block in downtown Riverside and is one of three National Historic Landmarks in California.

A 75-minute docent led tour (actually several to accommodate everyone) will allow you to experience the sights and sounds of turn-of-the-century Riverside at one of the nation's grand hotels.

Collections, gathered from around the world by the hotel's founder Frank Miller, have adorned its mix of architectural styles since it's earliest days. These include Lacquered Asian Temple guardians, life-sized papal court figures, Arts and Crafts furniture, Spanish and Mexican terra cotta, and hundreds of bells.

You will have time to visit the UCR California Museum of Photography, Riverside Municipal Museum, and the Riverside Art Museum which are all within a couple of blocks of the Mission Inn. There are antique stores and restaurants nearby.

Tickets The cost is \$50 per person which includes transportation, admissions costs for both tours, lunch and gratuities. Tickets will go on sale at the April 27th meeting at 6:30PM on a first come first served basis. Sorry, no early pre-orders or mail orders. You must be present to buy a ticket. Checks made to SDFWA preferred. Limit 2 tickets per person due to limited seating. - Buses will embark/debark in Mission Valley and North County Fair. **Complete Itinerary and boarding details will be provided with the tickets.**

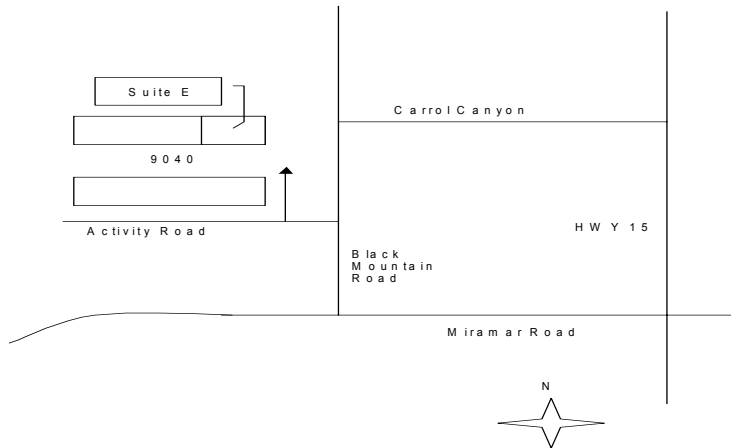
