March Program

A Dovetailed Hand Plane Talk

Ben Knebel, of the Shepherd Tool Company Inc. will be the guest speaker on the subject of infill planes. Ben and his partner Doug Evans are fine hand toolmakers, with a primary focus on dovetailed infill planes and kits in the tradition of Stewart Spiers of Ayr, Scotland. The presentation will cover the following topics: general hand plane history, infill plane history, types of infill planes, advantages of the infill plane and performance demonstrations. Examples of the process of filing dovetails, and peining them will be demonstrated. This is a rare and unique opportunity to witness the process that creates these fine 19th century hand tools. As an incentive to those that attend, Ben will be offering a 15% price reduction on all models at the close of the session.

In conjunction with this program, Ben will also be giving a lecture demonstration at Palomar College the next day, Thursday, March 31 at; 12:00pm in T-7. If you want to find out more about Shepherd, you can peruse their website at <http://www.shepherdtool.com>

Old Tool Swap Meet

A Reminder about the upcoming San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association's twice-a-year Old Tool Swapmeet on Sunday April 3rd.

The San Diego Rockler Woodworkers Store parking lot comes alive twice a year for you to buy, sell or trade tools, wood, and accessories. It doesn't cost a penny for either buyers or sellers, and it's almost time for the next one.

It's the first Sunday in April, (When Daylight Savings Time begins this year) so set your alarm the night before to get there when things start happening at 6:00 a.m. Pacific DAYLIGHT time.

It's free, but get there early for a good selling location and first choice on tools and other good stuff. Selling begins at 6:00 a.m. and ends about 11:00. The Rockler crew will have hot coffee and fresh donuts for sale. Rockler is located at 8199 Clairemont Mesa Boulevard, just west of 163.

DESIGN IN WOOD EXHIBITION 2005

This month the Fair Planning Committee will again build more new display cases like we did last year. We need 4 more cases to completely replace all the old black ones. We will be building these in the next few weeks and add them to the setup in May.

This year we celebrate the Design in Wood Exhibition's 24th year. The opening day is June 10 and will run through July 4th. The Fair will be closed Mondays, June 12, 19, & 26. Of course we need your assistance in making it all happen. Here is what you can do:

1. Sign up to be a floor walker
2. Sign up to make children's chairs
3. Sign up to do both of the above

Each time you sign up for a shift, you will receive two (2) free passes to the Fair. Sign up for back to back shifts, i.e. a shift in the shop then one on the floor and you get four (4) free passes.

We hope to have a current copy of the sign up sheet showing dates that are open on the SDFWA web site, www.sdfwa.org. As a floorwalker, you provide assistance by representing SDFWA and providing security for the exhibit. Although we have some staff working the exhibit, we don't have enough staff workers to cover the entire exhibit and need your help. No experience is needed. We will show you what to do. If you want to help out in the 19th Century Cabinet shop, make some very special chairs for charity, and learn how to use some great hand tools, I can guarantee you will have a great time. Again: no experience necessary. We provide on the job training.
