SHINEY SURFACES, BIG SMILES

"Look for one of the shop lights or your face reflecting on the surface of the chisel," said Doug Parker. The mirror-like finishes on the sharpened tools were impressive! There was a reason the sharpening system he taught us to use was called the Scary Sharp System.

The SDFWA Sharpening Seminar was a great success demonstrating that one of the most important aspects of this Association has to do with the interaction amongst the members. Contact with experienced and motivated instructors made the learning opportunities memorable, meaningful, and helpful. Most of the morning was broken up into different small group sharpening stations where individual questions were addressed. In the afternoon, members went back to the sharpening stations that interested them the most and sharpened tools they had brought with them.

I was impressed with the four generous instructors (Bob Stevenson-water stones, Ed Gladney-scrapers, Doug Parker-scary sharp system, Ron Rossi-Work Sharp machine) who took their Saturday to share with others what they had learned about sharpening tools. Dale Stauffer hosted the event at his shop situated out in the countryside.

The mentors are not representatives of some company pushing a certain brand of tool nor Internet woodworking newbies saying things that just aren't true or time tested. The mentors are helpful members sharing the pro and cons of tools/techniques as they have experienced them. I found all those who participated in learning from the mentor teachers learned new useful tips and skills no matter how much woodworking experience they had in the past.

The atmosphere was one of relaxed, focused, collaborative activity bent on imparting the gift of new skill acquisition. New friendships were made along with the excitement of going to the next level of woodworking after learning four distinct ways of sharpening tools. Many found the new Work Sharp Machine and also the new knife sharpening device by the same company interesting. Refreshments and a hot lunch were provided.

Do yourself a favor and look for the next seminars and shop tours offered by the San Diego Fine Wood Workers Association. You might find that you will make better decisions the first time using and buying equipment plus making some new lifelong friends with mutual interests. I did!

Carter Center Winter Weekend 2011

The Carter Center was founded by President and Mrs. Carter. Each year, the Carter Center sponsors a Winter Weekend that ends with a fund-raising auction. Russ Filbeck has been participating in the auction by donating his handmade Appalachian-style chairs and other items for several years.

Funds raised are used to support the Center's health and peace programs around the world. The work done by the Center has contributed to the near eradication of several devastating diseases affecting people in many countries around the world.

This year, the auction was held on February 26th in Port St. Lucie, Florida. Russ and Carol created and donated several items to the silent and live auction. Russ' cherry rocking chair, a replica of President Carter's personal rocker, sold for \$45,000 during the live auction. Carol created a beautiful heirloom silk dupioni christening gown which sold for \$5,000.

The Filbeck's contribution raised approximately \$85,000 this year. Their contributions over the past five years total more than \$200,000.

Mrs. Carter said, "Jimmy and I are deeply appreciative of the Filbeck's beautiful work and support of the Carter Center."

Next year's Carter Center Winter Weekend will be held at the Hotel Del Coronado in San Diego, CA, March 7-11, 2012.
