No sign up necessary for this. Just show up. No skill needed. If you have a screw gun, bring it. We will even feed you coffee and donuts in the morning and also provide lunch. Shop Tour

On Saturday May 17, 2003, 9am we will have a shop tour of the American School of French Marquetry, located at 3815 Utah Street, North Park, San Diego 92104 run by Patrick Edwards (Shop phone: 619 298-0864)

Patrick has served as Superintendent of the Design In Wood show for 9 years and has entered original work in Marquetry, Traditional, Contemporary and Clock categories during past shows. All his work is done with pre-industrial methods by hand. There are no power tools used in the fabrication of his projects.

The shop is divided into two areas. The front room is currently used as the American School of French Marquetry, where students can learn and work with 18th century Parisian methods to produce wood inlay pictures. Class schedule is posted on the website: www.WPatrickEdwards.com.

The rest of the shop is Antique Refinishers, where Patrick restores and copies 18th and 19th century European and American furniture, using period hand tools. His collection of hand planes and chisels is significant (not to mention spokeshaves). Most impressive is the massive beech workbench which he made in 1989 after air-drying the wood for nearly 12 years.

The shop is easily accessible from the 805 freeway. Take University Avenue/North Park Way off ramp and go 10 blocks WEST to Utah Street. (On the corner is KFC). Turn SOUTH to 3815 Utah (about 50 yards). The shop is located directly in front of Jefferson Elementary School.

San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association Survey May 1, 2003

San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association (SDFWA) is looking at acquiring floor space at Liberty Station on a long-term lease obligation. Liberty Station is the conversion of Naval Training Center San Diego through the Base Relocation and Closures Process. This lease could provide a monthly meeting location, an officer's meeting location, an office, workshop floor space controlled by SDFWA, a gallery for the sale of member created works, and an outside area for public displays and presentations during open house type periods. The details are not near firm so do not worry or wonder about what it will look like, exactly where it will be, what will be in it, when it will be open, or any details like those because the answers to those questions are what the committee is looking for through your guidance and input. This project will probably not reach a physical state until the 2004 or possibly 2005 timeframe.

Several meetings have been held and a fair amount of work has been accomplished towards the goals of getting this location. There remains a lot of work and a lot of questions that need to be addressed. At this point, the committee needs your help. This help is in the form of some honest answers so that the future of such a location can be evaluated.

The general area of the proposed site upon Liberty Station is about a 10-minute drive from the intersection of Interstate 8 and Interstate 5. Generally to the south along Rosecrans Street.
