EARLY 20th CENTURY AUTOMOBILES

This month's guest speaker will be Aaron Radelow. Aaron's work has been featured in numerous publications over the years; he is a memorable 2004 Best of Show winner with his Art Deco drinks cabinet in the Design in Wood.

Aaron's work embodies many different styles and levels of complexity. Currently he is working on building the coach for a 1907-08 Olds motorcar.

He will discuss pre-1915 automobile wood and aluminum body construction, the different types of woods used, where they were employed and why. He will also bring a full scale drawing of the coach he's currently constructing.

Other points of interest covered by Aaron will be the numbers of electric and steam powered automobiles going up against the gas fueled autos of the time. Aaron will also show some photos, via Power Point, of the rolling chassis, the start of construction, and pictures of the fire that almost burned everything into oblivion.

DESIGN IN WOOD VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION

SDFWA 2008 Seminar

Our seminar this year features Robert Lang, a world-renowned expert on arts and crafts furniture. He is the author of many books on craftsman furniture. Library Information

For members who want to learn more about specific topics, but who don't have time to attend classes at Palomar College, our organization has a series of possibilities. Videos can be obtained from our video library by sending a request plus money to pay for postage. If you are able to call (858-695-2460) or Email, (rtreese@gmail.com), I can often provide some advice as to which videos might be of most value.

For a number of years the Board of the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association has also made donations to the San Diego Public Library to help create a woodworking collection. That collection of 491 books and 86 videos now constitutes one of the finest in the nation. Our objective is to both continue to support this collection and to make sure it is available and used by all who might be interested. For those who have web access either at home, through your local library, your work, etc. the collection can be searched by typing San Diego Public library or sandiego.gov/public-library/ clicking on #2 Search the Library catalog and then entering the type of material you want to find. If you have trouble call or email me and I will walk you through it (858) 695-2460.

If you live close enough to any San Diego Public Library branch to make it convenient, you can obtain a free library card from them which will allow you to have any item sent to that branch where you can pick it up. You could still order the book by phone or by the web and receive a notice when it's ready for pick-up. For those in Chula Vista, the San Ysidro branch is likely to be the closest. We are trying to work with them to develop a better means of making the collection to all of our members and I will keep you posted of new developments.

If there isn't a San Diego Public Library branch nearby, you still have access to the collection via inter-library loan (ILL). You would request the book from your local library and that library will borrow it for you from the San Diego Public Library. Thanks to a cooperative library effort, if your 'home' library is any of the following there is no charge to ask your library to request the book from San Diego Public:

Carlsbad, Escondido, Oceanside, any branch of the San Diego County Library, and the following libraries in Imperial Valley—Brawley, Camarena (Calexico), El Centro, and Imperial Public. The following libraries charge a small per item fee, currently \$.50 at National City, \$2.00 at Coronado, and \$5.00 at Chula Vista.

The proposed 2009 budget suggested by Mayor Sanders includes such large cuts to the Public library's budget that every branch can expect to lose at least one full-time employee. Many of the braches have only three full-time employees currently, thus they will lose 1/3 of their full-time staff. A number of our members provide support to our local library branches now but if you are in a position to help your local San Diego Public Branch, please introduce yourself to the librarian telling them you are part of our organization. I am sure they will be glad to have your assistance.
