






July Shop Tour: Miniature Engineering Craftsmanship Museum

President's Message

Please, let me begin with a sincere apology to the 80 members and their guests who were disappointed with the sudden and unexpected cancellation of the bus trip to the Gamble House in Pasadena, and the Mission Inn in Riverside. Without an explanation, and without time for us to make alternative arrangements, the bus company cancelled the two buses for which we had contracted less than twelve hours before they were to meet us early Saturday morning. I can't express the outrage we feel because of this shabby treatment by the bus company but understand that we are looking into what might have caused this and what recourse is available to us. Appropriate steps were taken so the financial damages seem to be minimal, and we are already nearly done with refunding their money to those who signed up. From what I can see we did nothing wrong, but that doesn't diminish the disappointment we all suffered as the trip had to be cancelled. Hopefully, we can reschedule it sometime in the future, since it remains a must-see for many of us.

Ed Gladney and his gang are really getting ramped up now for Design In Wood, which will open on June 3. Please go on our website and **sign up for one or more sessions** of floor walking or working in the shop. This is an enjoyable thing for us to do and helps everyone enjoy the fair while ensuring that the exhibits don't get damaged; **plus you get free tickets**. As I prepare these remarks the entry time is drawing to a close. For sure there will be over 300 magnificent entries which will fascinate the public and us as well.

I hope you enjoyed the April General Meeting with Chance Coalter. Del Cover tells me that the speaker for the May meeting, which will be held on June 1 (due to a scheduling conflict with DIW), will be a representative from Toolmart talking about tool maintenance and minor repairs of power tools.

Mike Davis arranged for Ed Gladney and me to appear on a community TV show which highlighted our 35th anniversary and the DIW show. Several of us brought examples of woodworking projects and

it seemed to be a great opportunity to inform the public of the beautiful work that you guys are doing; as well as what our association is all about. I'm told that the show will appear several times this month and can be found on the cable networks at Channel 23 for Time Warner and Channel 16 on Cox. I hope you feel we represented you well. Thanks, Mike.

Lynn Rybarczyk recently shared his pictures and enthusiasm for the Portland, Oregon woodworkers' new shop and the positive effect it has had on their club; including a significant increase in membership. We should all be proud of the progress that our Member Shop idea has experienced to date. As you probably know, we are in the active fund raising phase of this project and the members have stepped up rather smartly, but we still need to raise about \$100,000 more before we can declare victory and rent a space. Remember, we won't be opening the shop until we can be sure of its financial foundation, so please give what you can and don't be embarrassed if it is not a large sum. Several have been able to make significant donations, but lots of smaller donations really do add up and will be critical to our success. We are flexible on how you make the payments; just join us soon.

Speaking of donations, I recently heard from the lawyer representing the Henry Wenc estate and he tells me that we will soon be receiving over \$30,000 from them. This is just tremendous news and comes at the perfect time. I must say that this demonstrates that remembering us in your will can be so important. You won't need the money any more, but whatever you chose to remember us with will go far in helping us meet our goals of serving the woodworkers of the San Diego area. We are in the process of adding some information to our website that we hope will be helpful to you in planning.

It has been suggested that we need to have some kind of activity, or activities, which will allow our members and their spouses to spend some time in a relaxed social engagement; such as a picnic. Please let me or someone else on the Board know if this appeals to you and if you would be willing to help or have ideas about location or other matters.

### **35<sup>TH</sup> Design in Wood Exhibition**

This is our 35<sup>th</sup> year. We have 388 entries from 223 exhibitors. We need your help to make this our finest year ever.

#### **We still need more volunteers**

Currently, we still need 89 slots to be filled; especially toward the end of the fair. There are still a few slots left in the chair shop, but we really need floor walker slots filled. Please consider signing up for a shift or two. Remember that this is your show. It has become the largest show of its kind in the country. We need your help to keep it as the best show possible.

#### **Help us make DIW a big success!**

The Design in Wood Exhibition opens on June 3, 2016, and runs through July 4, 2016. In order to properly staff the exhibit, we need more volunteers to walk the gallery floor and to help make chairs in the 19th Century workshop. Absolutely no experience or special skills are needed for either of these positions. Whatever you need to know will be taught to you when you show up for your shift. There are several advantages to donating some of your time:

1. On the gallery floor, you will have an opportunity to examine the entries; rather than just walk through quickly and glance at them. Fielding questions from the public could draw your attention to details that you might otherwise have overlooked. (Don't worry about questions to which you don't know the answers. You can always ask one of the staff members who will be nearby).
2. Working in the chair shop allows you to work with hand tools that you might seldom use. (Don't worry if you don't know how, because you will be given a short lesson, and you will look like an expert to the public).
3. For each shift, you will receive two fair tickets. Sign up for more than one shift and you might collect enough tickets for you, your family,

your friends and neighbors. You will have to use one (1) ticket for yourself in order to enter the fairgrounds each time you come for your shift.

4. Sign up for closing shifts on the gallery floor and receive four (4) tickets per shift.

## Notes from the Webmaster

San Diego Public Library**

**Our local public library has an impressive** collection of woodworking books. The [SD Public Library page](#) on our website has sample links directly into their catalog for topics of interest to woodworkers. Some can be found at the local branches, but most are housed at the downtown main library. SDFWA has contributed funds, which were also matched by the SD Library, to purchase some of these titles.

It's not easy to say how many woodworking books there are. The search for Furniture returns over 2,000 titles, while more specialized searches for carving or woodworking tools show 100 or 200

titles. Even then, there are some quirks in any cataloging system; the search for the topic of boat building inexplicably return many titles on body building – which I have tried (with some success) to filter out. You can also use keywords of your own choosing to find specific authors, publishers, or different specialty topics. And starting with those sample searches, or your own topics, you can use the tools on the left side of the library catalog pages to narrow down the list of selection shown until you find exactly what you're looking for.

Then you can use the library hold system – the buttons are right there in the catalog listings – to request material from any library location to be delivered to your local branch for pickup at your convenience. And I can tell that some people have done exactly that. Chance Coalter mentioned a woodworking book title at our April meeting, and I see that one person has checked it out, and two more are also waiting in line to see it. So some of you already know about all this stuff – this article is for those that haven't yet discovered how useful our public library can be for woodworkers.
