## **President's Message** **December, 2014**

In September, along with about 130 other SDFWA members, I was fortunate to see and hear Chris Schwarz demonstrate and teach the use of hand tools at our Fall Seminar. I've been reading his wonderful book, *THE ANARCHIST'S TOOL CHEST*. It's a comprehensive review of nearly every imaginable woodworking hand tool; written in an extremely informative, humorous, opinionated, at times irascible but scrupulously honest style. I'm glad to have a copy and it has caused me to reflect on the value of having a personal library of high quality works on the craft of woodworking

How does this relate to SDFWA? The most often cited reason for becoming a member is a desire to learn more about woodworking - usually stated with the expectation that someone else will do the teaching. The association tries hard to provide mentoring but does not always meet the demand. Few of us had a parent or grandparent as a teacher. Attending woodworking courses at Palomar College, workshops, seminars or an expensive in-residence course is not feasible for many of us. But it is possible to learn quite a lot on your own through reading. Today's woodworkers also have ready access to innumerable instructional videos on the internet or on loan from SDFWA.

I was fortunate to get started as a woodworker in junior high school shop class. The image on the right is my first serious project, a small spice cabinet made in that shop from a plan in Popular Science magazine about 60 years ago as a present for my mother. Thereafter my education in the craft was self-taught. Most of the progress I made over the following years (beyond the painful school of trial and error) came from reading magazines and, eventually, a collection of books. Only after I retired did I have the time and resources to attend workshops and seminars.

In my final message as President I would like to leave you with a reading list of some of the current favorites from my own library (several obtained at previous Fall Seminars). I hope one or more of these might be of use to you as a supplement to the mentor opportunities provided by our association.

It is not too early to start thinking about Design in Wood. The 2015 San Diego County Fair runs from June 5th through July 5th. This will be the 34th Annual Exhibition of Fine Woodworking sponsored by the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association. The theme for 2015 is “**A FAIR TO REMEMBER**”: **A Celebration of World's Fairs and Balboa Park**. This collaboration between the Del Mar Fairgrounds and the City of San Diego will commemorate the centennial anniversary of the 1915 Panama-California Exposition held in Balboa Park, and the great traditions and inventions arising from fairs around the world.

Now is the time to start working on your prize-winning entry. The deadline for entries will be May 1, 2015 with delivery on Thursday, May 28, 2015. Exhibit pickup will be July 6, 2015.

Design in Wood Planning Committee meetings will be held on the first Saturday of each month, January to May 2015, at 9:30am at Don Spangler's, 4372 Pocahontas Avenue, San Diego 92117. Parking is tight, so please car pool if you can. If you are interested in joining the planning committee, it is open to all SDFWA members. Just contact me to be added to the list. We are also interested in meeting with anyone who might be interested in a paid position at the Fair. Again, please contact me.

Set up will start on May 19th with the unloading of the trucks. Volunteers will be needed May 19 –May 23 to assist with the set up. There is over \$21,000 in prize money awarded each year at the Design In Wood show and SDFWA members have more chances to win than non-members. We would like to see more members enter so get started on those prize winning entries now!

## Report on Oct 18<sup>th</sup> Shop Tour

Like most woodworkers, Steve Rogers started working out of the garage. After moving numerous times during his 25 career in the Marines, leaving behind 8 garage shops he built along the way, he settled down in North County with enough space to build his dream shop. Steve hosted the October Shop tour in his Escondido shop. This metal 1050 square foot shop was a ground up building designed by Steve with a great view overlooking his Golden Nugget tangerine orchard. Steve said some of his ideas came from San Diego Fine Woodworking shop tours he had attended.

The dark hardwood floor is complemented with Baltic birch drawers. Greene and Greene style is the main theme throughout this great shop, even to the construction of all the shop drawers.

Steve's woodworking was displayed in a table he completed, a large picture frame he made for a picture of his orchard a friend painted, and a chair he is currently working on.

Steve also had a number of static equipment set-ups for viewing which had cards printed describing the tool or some interesting fact about it; some were passed down from his father. One card declared there over 600 square pegs in the shop benches. Attention to detail was not hard to see in all of the work surfaces.

Approximately 35 San Diego Fine Woodworking Association Members attended. Make sure you attend the next tour, there are always coffee, donuts and good ideas passed around.

## Hidden Valley House

Jim:

Recently my husband, Harry, ran into Bob Reese at the Scripps Ranch Library. They struck up a conversation, and Bob invited us to his home that weekend to see the hand-crafted toys that were made by the San Diego Fine Woodworkers' Association members. Upon arrival at Bob's home and viewing the hand-crafted cars, trucks, doll beds, high chairs, etc. for children that were available for donation to Hidden Valley House, I couldn't believe our good fortune. Bob helped us carry out 50+ toys to my car for distribution at the shelter. We understood that some of the toys could be outright gifts to a child and others were to remain at the shelter for future children to enjoy.

The generosity, time, talent and expertise of your members in making these durable wooden toys and donating them to children in need is highly commendable. We accepted the generous donation of these toys from Bob, and they were hand delivered to the shelter the following week. I spoke to the Shelter Manager, Carmen Maldonado, on Monday and explained about the donation and the philanthropic work done by your Association and its members. She was very appreciative of your gift and asked me to convey her thanks to you!

Hidden Valley House is a safe haven for woman and children who suffer from domestic abuse. Often times they leave their homes with nothing but the clothes on their back. Hidden Valley House provides shelter, food, clothing, counseling, and other services as needed to support these women and their children until they can find an alternative safe environment. Some are there only a couple of days...others stay a month or longer.

Hidden Valley House Auxiliary, of which I'm a member, has been in existence for over 10 years and is dedicated to providing additional support to the shelter as needed. We raise money once a year through our annual High Tea in Scripps Ranch, and the funds are used for various needs for the shelter. Funds we've risen have gone for new roofs, new beds, school supplies, Christmas Bags of goodies for the Moms at the holidays, food and numerous other items...too many to mention. You can find out more about our organization

by reading the Scripps Ranch Newsletter each month.

Bob asked if Hidden Valley House might have a need for a small table/4 chairs for the children. When I spoke to Carmen, she said that sounded like a great idea, as they have a Children's Room set aside just for the children in which to play. Bob showed me one he'd made for his own grandchildren. It looked the perfect size for toddlers. But I was also thinking, if possible, Hidden Valley House might benefit from a table a little larger as well. Maybe the size for ages 5 to 7 or 8. A little larger in dimension, and a little taller than the one he'd shown me.

Jim, I don't know if this request is possible in the grand scheme of things. If not, due to all your other commitments that is certainly understandable. We sincerely appreciate the recent donation and wanted to take this opportunity to say "A BIG THANK YOU" to you and all your members for the good work you are doing.
