Alice Suszynski is the proprietor of Aunt Alice's Woodshop. Alice is an award winning craftsperson who has worked in her field for over twenty-five years. After completing a four year apprenticeship, she went on to master almost every facet of cabinetmaking. Ten years ago she took on the challenge of designing and crafting fine furniture. Her inspiration has always been the Arts and Crafts movement of the early twentieth century. She has studied the work of such masters as Frank Lloyd Wright, the Greene brothers and Mackintosh. It is Alice's aim to infuse her work with the spirit of that age, but not to copy work which has been designed by others. Alice is a frequent exhibitor and prize winner at the Design in Wood show at Del Mar. There is sure to be something for everyone to learn from Alice.
