Details: I began wood working again after a 20 year break, my wife talked me into building her a curio cabinet (made from oak) - rough dimensions 6 feet tall, 5 wide and 3 deep. The construction went reasonably well. However the finishing has not. Stain was never my strong suit, but this project requires it. I have stained and stripped the cabinet twice (both times because the stained didn't go on evenly - managed that one the third time around). I used Endro water based stain and then the sanding sealer. I have now applied a heavy coat of sanding sealer over the stain - they are both water based and the combination ran in a few places. To add insult to injury I sanded through the sanding sealer and stain in a couple of places. Since a portion of the cabinet is veneer I don't want to risk sanding it back more than once more. I can work on the project nights and weekends and live near the lake Jennings exit of the 8. I'll do the work, I just need someone to point me in the right direction and keep me on track. Shop Tips

The following shop tips have been collected from various woodworking associations.

July 1999 From "Knothole News" (Green County Woodworkers, Tulsa, OK) is a suggestion for a simple workbench top. A 30 X 80 flush-panel, solid-core door (lauan facing, about \$50) will serve well. Len's variation is a sheet of 3/4" MDF, ripped in half and glued face to face. This gives a bench top 1-1/2" thick, 24" wide. This can be cut from 96" to any desired length. Or a piece of 1" particle board topped with 1/4" double-tempered hardboard will do well.

9/16/99 From "Knothole News" (Green County Woodworkers, Tulsa OK) Plywood Carrying - Carrying a 4 X 8 foot sheet of plywood or particle board by yourself is no easy task. Here's how to carry it without throwing out your back. Take an 18 to 20 foot long piece of rope and tie the ends together. Lean the plywood sheet on its long edge and slip a rope loop around each lower corner. Then reach over the sheet, grab the rope in the middle and lift, steadying the sheet with your free hand. With the 4 X 8 secured between your arm and torso it is easy to walk without losing your balance or straining your muscles.

October 1999 "Knothole News" (Green Country Woodworkers, Tulsa, OK). Attach a spring clip to the hood of your drill press (screw, adhesive or magnet. Make a set of cards with the possible drill press speeds. Insert in the clip, with the current speed displayed on top. Len's variation on this: For a five-speed drill press, list the speeds on each edge of a pentagon-shaped card, displaying the current speed at the top. For a 12-speed unit, make a hexagon-shaped card, listing half the speeds on one face, the remainder on the opposite face

November 1999 Green County Woodworkers "Tips to Ponder" are these quick tips. Remove the small plastic nozzles from the tops of your empty spray cans and store them in a jar of mineral spirits. Then, when a nozzle becomes clogged, just replace it with one of the clean ones from the jar.

To cushion the jaws of pliers and prevent scratching items, make covers for the jaws from old leather gloves. Cut off two fingers from a glove and slip them over the pliers jaws. To keep them from slipping off, set them in place with hot-melt glue.

January 2000 "Wood Chips" (Ariz. Ass'n of Fine Woodworkers) Vol 18, No.1, J. Walterbach. Why are some 1/4-inch dowels not the same as your 1/4-inch drill? This is really annoying if you are trying to put a dowel in a hole you have just drilled. To solve this for oversize dowels, drill a 1/4-inch hole in a piece of steel plate. Cut the dowel a bit long and force it through the steel plate, which will shave it to size so that it almost fits the intended hole.

July 2000 "R.I.P.S.A.W." (Wisconsin Woodworkers Guild)

Aging Cherry with Potassium Dichromate. Start with one teaspoon of crystals in one quart of water and try it on a sample first. You can add applications until you get the desired look. Wait about 4-6 hours between applications, which are additive. If three applications are what you want, you can use three tsp of crystals per quart to get the same result in a single application.

It is best if you raise the grain first with water and sand it smooth. Better, do this twice, then apply the solution. You will have minimum grain raising, which can be easily rubbed off. The potassium dichromate can be purchased as Dichromate of Potash from Garrett-Wade, Product #99P61.00 (phone (800) 221-2942)
