### **Faux Painting**



The September program will be a demonstration of faux painting techniques by Jennifer Guerin, a local artist and designer. Jennifer recently was part of the HGTV Design Star show which is on HGTV Sunday nights.

## Sam Maloof on Work and Life

**Below is a copy of Sam Maloof's Commencement Address to the University of California, Riverside 2006, California State University, San Bernardino, 2007 and Mt, San Antonio College 2007. It so concisely summed up his passion for work and life.**

I was really very surprised when I was asked to address you today, I did not graduate from college...I did not even attend college.

There could only two possible reasons I have been invited to speak to you - perhaps it is because I am known for designing and making chairs, or --- perhaps it is because I am 91 years old and still working at my trade and loving it.

What I should be known for is having chosen a life that has brought success and happiness. So, I will tell you what I know about how to make a chair.

First - the legs - the support for the chair. They are the foundation. They are what hold you up...values, principals and beliefs - make sure you have enough legs.

The arms - something to hold on to. They are the friends, partners and family who embrace you...choose them carefully.

The back - the back keep you upright and steady - and helps you look straight ahead - to focus on your goals. The back should be strong and comfortable.

The seat - does it sit well? Specifically, does it fit YOU? Choose YOUR heart's desire...be sure it is your choice...Your chosen path.

As you journey through life - reflect on what will be your legs --- your arms -- your back --- your seat, Good chairs are not made of straight lines but of many curves --- and so will be your life.

So this what I have learned about making a chair that can serve for lifetime, something that you will enjoy sitting in --- and others will also appreciate.

Now, because you are smart, young college graduates, you are already that when I say, "This how to build a chair," you know what I really mean is' --- "This is how you build your life." You are the artist and designer --- so go build your chair thoughtfully and construct a worthy and happy life.

Rare Set of J. Addis pre-WWII Carving Chisels. This set of antique carving chisels includes 15 J. Addis chisels and one Henry Taylor.

These chisels are suitable for carving larger works. They are in fine condition with good/solid handles, most apparently original. Two are missing their ferrules.

They are enclosed in a poplar clamshell carrying case of the same vintage as the tools.

Note:

We distributed to each organization at least 100 toys. Sometimes the distribution has small items such as hand held cars, or cell phones or wooden cameras. The bigger toys such as the Jeeps, trucks or push toys such as the grasshopper would be fewer.

Some of these organizations have more than one office. Say San Diego, a county organization has six offices. We eventually distribute 100 toys to each office.

Some organizations have requested repeated donations because they process refugees. The Jewish Family Center and Catholic Refugee Center have people who have arrived in the United States, receive orientation and medical treatment and then eventually move to other cities. Because they are not stationary, we distribute small toys, such as small cars, cell phones wooden puzzles etc.

When we receive the toys from production we sort them out so each organization receives a balanced sampling.

We have also distributed chairs to many of these organizations. We would distribute 1, 2, 4, or 6 depending on the request and purpose. We do not "overload" one organization and we try to distribute toys throughout San Diego County.
