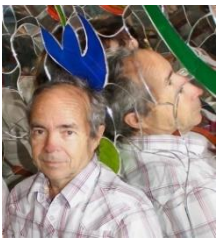

SDFWA is doing its part in this scenario with a busy month of activities starting with our Fall Seminar followed by a shop tour and our general membership meeting on September 30.

Following a very successful Design In Wood show at the fair, Ed Gladney has been busy getting the Fall Seminar organized. Many of you have already signed up to attend the Seminar, but there is still room for a few more. I encourage you to try it out, the cost is quite reasonable, the program promises to be very interesting and educational, **and we feed you well.** The seminar starts with an introductory meeting on Friday night (7 to 9), and then two full days of class on Saturday and Sunday the 19th and 20th; beginning at 8 AM. Steve Latta, who has an enviable resume in both contemporary and traditional furniture, will lead us through making a Federal Side Table. Following a most pleasant tour of Tony Tait's beautiful new shop in July, Dale Stauffer has arranged for us to tour the shop of Russ Fillbeck on Saturday, September 26, beginning at 9 AM. As most of us know, Russ has had an interesting life and is an exemplary member and woodworker. I'm not sure what there was about duty on a submarine that led to his dedication to woodworking, but I'm glad he saw the light. His address is 11088 Delphinus Way in San Diego. We should have a map or directions up on the website soon. And, while on the subject of shop tours, the one after that will be on November 7 at the Studio 6608 which is bound to be interesting. Again, check the website for further information and directions.

Frank Townsend had us spellbound at our July general membership meeting with his slides and talk about his experience leading the construction of the sailing ship, San Salvador. How about Del Cover's timing to arrange this program on the very evening following the launching of the ship that afternoon? Several of our members worked as volunteers on this fascinating project and I was pleased to note that several members brought their wives to this meeting to learn about this new landmark on the San Diego shoreline. Del has arranged for Ken Minusian to make a presentation on ukulele building at our next meeting to be held on Wednesday evening, September 30, at 7. We look forward to seeing you there.

Rockler's parking lot was the scene of the Old Tool Swap Meet on August 2 and will again serve as the location for our next one on November 1 beginning at 6 am (seriously). It's amazing, what stuff they have available for sale that you didn't know you needed and generally at very reasonable prices.

Gary Anderson has been keeping us up to date on the continuing progress of his committee and their study of a potential Member Shop. They have now taken the Board through their analysis of the means and amounts of revenue projected to result from operating such a shop and estimates of the expected operating costs. This means that we are nearing a decision point on whether to engage in the critical fund raising effort necessary to get a shop started. Thanks to the nearly 400 of you who responded to their survey, it seems that the interest is quite broad and support is deeper than some expected. I'm not sure yet, but it looks like we may ask for a membership vote on this proposal at our January general membership meeting, so stay tuned. Thanks also for a non-member, Tom Brady, who so very generously donated a CNC machine which could serve as the foundation of a Member Shop.

I hope that everyone has now had a chance to view the special video produced by our Historian, Lou Adzima, about the Children's Chair project done in the 18th century shop as a part of the DIW show at the Fair. Thanks go to Lou for documenting this, which has been

a key program of SDFWA for so many years, along with special thanks to Bob Bostick for leading us through the process on the video. If you haven't seen it yet, you can get connected to this and other such videos through our website.

Turning to the commercial side of things, there are some new resources available to us. Many will remember Tool Depot down near the Sports Arena; it has now reopened in the same general area. I don't have an address yet, but I'm sure you will be able to locate it as many will recall that they offer a wide variety of woodworking tools and accessories along with a great repair shop. Also, I was contacted by a new member, Derick Wyman, with the news that he has opened a new gallery in Liberty Station offering furniture for sale together with a variety of hardwoods which he is willing to discount for our members, just show your card. Their website is calihardwoods.com. Finally, Glen Huey, who taught our Fall Seminar a few years ago, contacted us to let us know that he is now affiliated with an online woodworking site entitled 360woodworking. Until October 31, they are offering a discounted annual membership at \$90 and for each 10 new members who identify themselves as being members of SDFWA, they will donate \$100 to our association.



2015 Fall Seminar Report:

In July, after the fair, I had the privilege of being invited to observe a TAV (Turn Around for VETs) turning session by retired General Tom Lightner. Tom wanted me to see the type of thing our seminar raffle goes to support each year. As you seminar attendees know, we hold a raffle each year at end of the seminar. We sell tickets and raffle off the item being built by our seminar speaker, plus a major tool donation by Rockler. All the money raised goes to the TAV program. The San Diego Woodturners started this program several years ago and it has grown to supporting three centers in San Diego. They operate at three locations: Naval Medical Center, San Diego; Wounded Warrior Battalion, Camp Pendleton; and the Veterans Affairs Care Center near Old Town. I visited the Veteran's Affairs Center and participated in their program. I can tell you that they had a full house with many vets learning to turn, some for the first time, and

many returning for more sessions. The TAV program has been so successful that it has been added to the curriculum at the center. The money taken in at the fair by the turners also goes to support this program. Rockler uses the donations to supply pen turning kits to the program at their cost. Mike Durlak has been very supportive of the program. It is a truly great program and we are happy to support it.



One item we will **not** have to spend money on is a large CNC machine. Tom Brady (no, not the football player) has donated a CAMaster 4'x6' CNC router with a 4th-axis lathe attachment. It includes the control computer, WinCNC, and BobCAD software packages. Original cost was approximately \$20,000. Jeff Bratt has been coordinating the acquisition, and with help from Phil Goetsch, will move it to and store it in his garage until its final destination is nailed down. This type of specialized equipment is one of the things that will make our Member Shop even more valuable to our Members. Thank you again, Mr. Brady!! (and Jeff and Phil!)

I do have an opening on our Member Shop Committee that I need your help in filling. The person who had volunteered to head up a Grant Writing effort to help fund the Shop is unable to continue in that position. So, if you or another member you know has any experience in Grant Writing and can help us out, please let me hear from you.

Finally, let me stress again that this effort is intended to be a very open and inclusive process. Your thoughts, questions, ideas and help are needed to make sure we do this right. Please don't hesitate to contact me with your input. Gary Anderson pinz711@aol.com

Since we have not yet identified a location/space, it's difficult to know precisely what our expenses will be. However, it's clear that they will be significant. Tony Tait's Shop Tour

On July 11th, Tony Tait held his shop tour in Poway, CA. Tony began woodworking in 1973 when he bought a used 1953 Shopsmith; a mirror and rocking horse were some of his first creations. In 2004, Tony sold his 1953 Shopsmith and bought the San Diego County Fair special, a new Shopsmith 520, which you can see in the corner of his shop today. Tony's first shop, like those of many members, started in his garage where he made many practical items for his family and others. A chest of drawers was one of his first large pieces. Tony is a retired union stagehand who worked in San Diego and Las Vegas, where he received a lot of "on the job training" building stage scenery.

Tony built this great new shop over the last year, finishing it in January 2015. Tony designed the shop, poured the concrete and contracted with Tuff Shed to build the custom building. The shop has 2x6 framed exterior walls that have been insulated to R-19, with R-30 insulation in the ceiling. Tony did all the electrical work himself, installing the service panel, all the lighting and outlets. He also installed the AC/Heating "heat pump" which keeps the shop at an even temperature all year round.

Tony is currently enrolled in Palomar College and is building the clock project. He would like to expand his woodworking to include more Arts & Crafts projects. Tony has also completed a nice sewing room for his wife, Debbie. Debbie and he have just lived at the address for the past year and a half. They have accomplished a lot in a short time.

You will also hear a lot from Tony at each meeting, as he is our sound technician at the monthly SDFWA meetings.
